Covid-19 Policies/Procedures

If you are experiencing any of the following COVID-19 symptoms as per the government of Ontario guidelines:

- Fever
- Chills
- Cough that's new or worsening (continues, more than usual)
- Barking cough, making a squeaky or whistling noise when breathing (croup)
- Shortness of breath (out of breath, unable to breath deeply)
- Sore throat
- Difficulty swallowing
- Please stay home if you or anyone that you been in contact are showing any signs that are listed above.



Covid-19 Policies/Procedures

- Practice Physical distancing when around other members, visitors and employees. Keep min. 2 meters apart.
- When physical distancing is not possible proper PPE MUST be worn.
- Wash hands regularly when water and soap is available
- Disinfect your hands with alcohol based (min. 70%) hand sanitizer regularly
- Use latex or rubber gloves when using communal tools or sanitize them after use.
- When in pit area and after helmets are removed it is advised to wear a face mask or head sock when distancing is not possible
- RESPECT other members space and property



Covid-19 Policies/Procedures

- Portable washrooms will be space 6 feet apart.
- Portable washrooms will have hand sanitizer inside and outside of them.
- If you showing signs after visiting the track of COVID-19, please phone track facility immediately.
- So we can contact anyone that was at the track during that day.



Physical (Social) Distancing

- GATES to paddock area will closed during each session.
- We strongly recommend everyone have a mask & gloves when physical distancing is not possible. Safety of our staff and visitors are our priority. The track will not be providing for nonemployees at this time.
- Track sessions are limited, and each driver is allowed 1 guardian or 1 mechanic for each driver.
- Upon arrival a spot will be assigned to you in the paddock
- **NO SPECTATORS ALLOWED** during the first phase.

TAKE NOTICE: People who ignore Physical (Social) distancing procedures will be asked to leave the premises at any given time throughout the day



Track Procedure Overview

- Point Pelee Karting Club is to follow and enforce all government stipulated guidelines for health and safety of us all. It is our responsibility to remain constantly aware of the protocols associated with preventing and spread of Covid-19.
- As the pandemic subsides, we **MUST** all do our part to remain vigilant to ensure safety for all.
- Please note that these procedures only represent the first stage and as the situation evolves, we will continue to move ahead towards a normal karting experience.
- **DURING YOUR TRACK VISIT YOU MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- Failure to meet you will be asked to leave the premise. Please **DO NOT** visit if you are showing symptoms of COVID-19





Crown Medical Transportation

- Training and procedures, we have implemented regarding handling the COVID 19 virus and transporting patients is as follow:
 1. All transporting personnel are equipped with (PPE) and are instructed to use them at all times.(medical mask, gowns, cloves and eye protection if needed.) And maintain 6 feet if possible but we all know that is impossible in this line of work.
 2. Linen used in our transport vehicles are changed after every patient stretcher will be cleaned disinfected with disinfecting wipes and then use fresh linen for the next patient
 3. Soiled linen in automatically sealed in plastic bags awaits cleaning and disinfecting on site every night.
 4. Cleaners are supplied with medical mask, gowns, heavy industrial grade gloves, eye protection, strong disinfecting product including bleach in some cases.



Crown Medical Transportation

After each transfer:

1. Remove used linens
2. Disinfect and sterilize stretcher and equipment used
3. Disinfect the vehicle and the area where the patient was
4. Use fresh clean linen
5. Team will use fresh gloves mask with every patient.

Vehicle deep cleaning:

Our vehicles deep cleaning is done daily after every shift unless a vehicle becomes deeply contaminated then that unit will be brought into our base to get deep cleaned right away

1. Remove all equipment from the unit (stretcher, wheelchair, etc..)
2. Empty all waste containers clean and disinfect before returning them to the unit.
3. Vacuum and clean the floor ,disinfect all hard surfaces.
4. Remove all soiled linens
5. Restock the unit according to our inventory list.
6. Return all equipment to the unit after cleaning and disinfecting



Track Restrictions

- Track facility is OPEN to PRIVATE kart owners and / members ONLY within a controlled environment with gates closed.
- Absolutely NO SPECTATORS as limited number of visitors on-site at one time. Only Driver's and mechanic currently.
- Public walk-in will be limited amount according to the track.
- Season practice membership is required through mail 2136 manning RD. Windsor, ON, N8N 2L9. Option to drop of in person as well. Drop box available.
- "Release and waiver" is mandatory and must have available prior to arriving for your session.
- Upon arrival you will be directed to your paddock area. Please ensure you maintain your space and the required physical distancing during that time.
- Washrooms and hand washing will be available on site and will be restricted to outside facility only.
- Garbage will be your responsibility at this time and must leave the area clean. All garbage must be taken with you until further notice.
- Garage will be CLOSED and not available to members or visitors.



Scaling Area Protocol

- For scaling the kart, only one kart under the tent with the driver and one parent for scaling the kart.
- The kart can't be lifted onto the track stand until it out of the tent area.
- Follow social distance and tape on the ground.
